At this time the required number of educators will be rostered on for the activity. Educators will be notified of their supervision responsibilities before departing for the excursion, with any changes being addressed to all educators if the need arises. (Eg year groups, environments) All volunteers will require current volunteers Working with Children Check numbers. Parents will be contacted to collect sick children immediately from BASC or the excursion venue Sick children will be isolated from other children in the BASC office until they are collected. The area will be thoroughly cleaned & sanitised after they have departed. VAC Coordinators will ensure excursion venues have COVID-19 safe practices. | Children will be in public | may be exposed to inappropriate behaviour from members of the public | Moderate | Before the excursion departs the educators will hold a safety talk with children, discussing the appropriate behaviour expected of them while in public and what to do if they feel unsafe. | | | | Educators will decide on the safest route, discussed prior to excursions if possible, avoiding all hazards. There will be an educator at the front and back of the children's line at all times. Educators will monitor the traffic conditions, cross any roads at lights/pedestrian crossings where possible and have a nominated traffic monitor who remains on the road when children are crossing to ensure cars are stopped should they come along. | | |

| Children will be transported to and from the excursion via bus | Children may be injured by traffic getting on and off the bus Children may be involved in a traffic collision while riding the bus Children may be injured if the bus stops suddenly Boarding and disembarking coach/bus | Moderate | Children may only enter the bus if it is stopped next to the curb on the side of the road closest to where the children have come from e.g. school side of Wellington Street. Educators will lead children onto the bus and guide the appropriate number of children into seats to ensure no overcrowding. Children will be instructed to sit with their backs against the seat at all and their bags beneath the seat. Children are prohibited from standing up on the bus when it is moving. If the bus has seat belts all children will be required to use them. Children will remain in school grounds till bus is stationary in a safe place for children to board the bus Children will be led by an educator onto the bus with a second educator following from behind. Educators will instruct children to walk safely in 2 lines. An educator will conduct a head count when children enter and exit the bus ensuring that it matches the roll. | Children and Educators | Entire duration of excursion |
| Lost child | • Lost child | High | Children will have a buddy who they must stay with for the day, if a child's buddy is missing they are to report to a staff member immediately. Children will wear the BASC purple wristband with the centre phone number and green or blue bibs so they are easily identified at all times on the excursion Educators will be stationed at the beginning and end of children lines when the group is transitioning. Educators will take roll calls at the beginning of the day before children leave the premises and will record the number of children present, this roll & headcounts will be repeated throughout the day with the time of day being recorded each time. Educators will inform children of a meeting place in the venue & safe adults for children to approach (eg venue staff, families) if they become lost while on excursion. | Children and Educators | Entire duration of excursion |

| Outdoor play | Exposure to UV rays and Sunburn | Moderate | Children will wear hats, sunscreen and sleeves whilst outdoors. Children will stay in the shade when the UV index is at an unsafe level and will be in the shade when possible at all other times. Staff members will assist children in reapplying sunscreen at four hour intervals, or every two hours in extreme weather conditions. | Children and Educators | Entire duration of excursion |

| Children have an Asthmatic or Anaphylactic attack | Asthmatic children having an asthma attack due to over exerting themselves. Anaphylactic children having an attack during food breaks or exposed to allergens. | Hlgh | First aid kit will be brought on the excursion, containing asthma puffers, spacers and the epipens of any anaphylactic children. The emergency folder containing all children's medical actions plans will be brought on the excursion. All educators will be aware which children are asthmatic and/or anaphylactic, they will endeavour to know the children by name, face and build relationships with them. Educators will encourage asthmatic children to have plenty of rest breaks to minimise the chance of an attack. Children will be directed away from any areas exposed to asthma triggers such as smoke, dust etc. Educators will be especially vigilant when observing anaphylactic and asthmatic children. Children and educators will wash their hands before and after eating and transitions. Parents will be cautioned about the amount of allergen containing foods they provide their children. Educators will discreetly let the instructors know which children have medical conditions. During the safety talk, educators will discuss with children how to be safe concerning allergies, asthma and anaphylaxis. | Children and Educators | Entire duration of excursion |
| Children will use public toilets | May suffer abuse from members of the public Children may be injured in toilets | Moderate | Educators will check the toilets before the children enter to ensure that there are no members of the public using them. Children will go to the toilet with a buddy at all times. When groups of children go to the toilet the staff member assisting them will do a headcount before and after they go to the toilet. Children will be respectful to other members of the public when entering and exiting the toilets. | Children and Educators | Entire duration of excursion |

| Weather | Children become sick or in extreme cases develop hypothermia if they remain in the wet for long periods. Lightning Strong winds risk of illness/injury resulting from heat stress, sunburn, poor air quality or storms | High | Wet weather plans will be created for outdoor excursions Children will not stand in the rain for long periods. Outdoor excursions will be cancelled in the event of dangerous weather conditions e.g lightning or strongs winds. Educators will ensure all children are wearing sun safe hats and clothing. Educators will apply sunscreen every 2 hours When the group is to stop educators will endeavour to be out of direct sunlight. Educators will find location of water bottle refill stations from venue workers | Children and Educators | Entire duration of excursion |

All large vehicles are chaperoned by taronga zoo staff to assist with crowd control. For escalation of medical aid, please approach Taronga Zoo staff as Taronga Zoo's emergency response plan can be implemented, which includes occupational first aid responders or emergency code calls, including external communication with emergency services. Children accessing behind the scenes areas to be accompanied by Taronga Zoo staff at all times and briefed on safety hazards related to potential trip or slips. Clear, maintained, compacted visitor walkways around all teaching locations Logs and rocks are low in height and surrounded by mulch and/or grass in outdoor classrooms | Children and Educators | Entire duration of excursion |
